2021-2022 Arbor Day Poster Contest

“Trees Work for A Healthier Me” is the theme of this year’s Missouri Arbor Day Poster Contest for 5th grade students.

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE? All students currently in the fifth grade.

TO EDUCATE

Go to the Missouri Community Forestry Council website at www.mocommunitytrees.org, and download the **“Trees Work for A Healthier Me”** curriculum. It is available as a pdf document including curriculum and visual aids you can use in your classroom.

TO ENTER

Encourage your fifth-grade students to design their poster to reflect the theme and educational curriculum **“Trees Work for A Healthier Me”**.

Be sure posters follow the contest rules and judging criteria as outlined below.

CHOOSING THE SCHOOL WINNERS: Each school must pick one poster **based on technical merit** to represent their school.

DEADLINE: Your school’s original winning poster must be received by the City of Springfield’s office at 1010 W Chestnut St no later than **the second Thursday of November**.

The posters will be judged by Missouri Community Forestry Council members on **the third Tuesday of November**. The statewide winner for technical merit will be notified immediately. First through third place will be recognized.

The top twelve posters for technical merit will be scanned and posted on the Missouri Community Forestry Council Facebook Page for a popular vote/people’s choice award. Popular vote poster will be determined by the number of likes that poster receives by 6pm the second Friday of December. The popular vote poster will be tallied based on the poster with the highest number of likes and the winner will be announced on Facebook!



PRIZES FOR EVERYONE!

All teachers who send in their school's winning poster will receive:

- Pencils to present to each student who drew a poster.

PRIZES FOR WINNING TEACHER

The teacher of the state technical merit winner will receive:

- \$200 Visa Gift Card for classroom materials.
- A book selected by the Missouri Department of Conservation

2nd Place winning teacher will receive a \$100 gift card for classroom materials.

3rd Place winning teacher will receive a \$50 gift card for classroom materials.

PRIZES FOR WINNING STUDENTS (TECHNICAL MERIT)

The student who wins the state contest will receive:

- A \$100 gift card courtesy of Forest ReLeaf of Missouri.
- A commemorative tree will be planted on the school grounds or public property in the winner's community.
- A framed certificate honoring their achievement will be presented at the tree planting ceremony.
- Various 'Trees Work' materials.
- Possible recognition in MDC's publications and social media.

2nd Place Technical Merit will receive a \$75 gift card.

3rd Place Technical Merit will receive a \$50 gift card.

PRIZES FOR THE WINNING STUDENT (POPULAR VOTE)

The student who wins the popular vote will receive:

- 'trees work' promotional items.
- \$50 gift card.

Contest Rules and Judging Criteria for Technical Merit

- ▶ All entries must be the original artwork created by a student currently in the 5th grade. A student may enter the contest only once. No trademarked characters or designs are allowed.
 - ▶ The student's first and last name must be **written** or **signed** in the lower right-hand corner on the front of the poster.
 - ▶ Entries must be no smaller than 8½" X 11" and no larger than 11" X 17".
 - ▶ Artwork may be done in marker, crayon, watercolor, ink, acrylic, colored pencil, or tempera paint. Computer or photo generated art and/or printing is not acceptable. Collages are acceptable. Posters must be two dimensional.
 - ▶ Entries must be done on paper and in a manner that will allow for duplication, display, and framing.
 - ▶ The poster must relate to the contest theme in some way. The theme **"Trees Work for A Healthier Me"** must be on the poster. **All words must be spelled correctly. Make the theme stand out!**
 - ▶ Avoid use of business names or logos.
 - ▶ Teacher must complete the School Student Report Form and attach it to the back of the poster. Do not send more than one poster.
 - ▶ Entries must be mailed flat, and should not be matted, mounted, laminated, framed, or folded.
 - ▶ **Your schools winning poster must be received by the second Thursday in November.**
